### Marion Old Fashion Days Are Here!

It's that time of year again, with the Marion Old Fashioned Days in full steam this weekend, from Thursday, July 31, 2025, to Sunday, August 3, 2025. To say this year is going to be A-M-A-Z-I-N-G would be an understatement! With MORE vendors, an Inflatable Costume Race, and Music on Main Glow Party with music by A Little Reckless, complete with a fireworks show, it is sure to be a rockin good time!

Of course, all the events you've come to know and love will be at Old Fashioned Days. Greased Pig contest, kids' games, cornhole tournament at the Horseshoe Bar, Disc Golf Tournament at the Fairgrounds on Marion's own disc golf course, the famous Duck Race, the 5K walk/run, button raffle, Demolition Derby (!!!), beverage tent

Kid's Parade and the Grand Parade, which starts on Saturday at 10:30 a.m. from the High School down 20 Mile Rd.

With all the events occurring over the course of four days, a complete list of all events, times, and dates can be found on the Marion Old Fashioned Days Facebook page or posted at most of the Marion area businesses in town!

On Friday, there's a rummage sale at Marion United Methodist Church from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m and a book sale at the Marion Area District Library from 10 ro 5. For the kids, there will be pony rides on Main St. starting at noon, and the Middle Branch Revival will be filling the air with music across from the Village Hall at 4 p.m. From 5 p.m. until 8 p.m. the Cruise line up will begin

Join in the fun for the Cornhole Tournament at Veteran's Memorial Park. Registration begins at 6 p.m. The Disc Golf Tournament sign up begins at 6:30 p.m. at the site next to Fairgrounds, with tournament starting at 7 p.m. The Music Junkies are playing at the Horseshoe Bar and Larry Stevens at the Eagles. Of course the Beer Tent will be open too at the Horsehoe Bar!

Saturday is when things really kick up. If you're a morning bird who craves moving in the wee hours, the 5K run/walk might be for you. Meet at the Marion High School Cross Country Course for a 7 a.m. start. Manny of the vendors will be opening up early as well, with many starting at 8 and 9 a.m. Golf Scramble, Softball Tournament, and a 3 on 3 Basketball Tournament all begin at 8 a.m.

The Children's Parade registration begins at 9 a.m., with the parade at 9:30 a.m. Sign up is at the Layline parking lot and is open for those 16 and under. Pony rides, Marion Area District Library book sale, Marion Methodist Church rummage sale all start at 10 a.m. along with the beer tent at the Horseshoe Bar; the Eagles Beverage Tent will also be open as the Arm Wrestling Tournament (11:30 a.m. at the Horseshoe Bar) and the 10 a.m. Penny Scramble for kids 10 and under on Main Street.

up begins early, around 9:30/10 a.m., and the parade itself starts at 10:30. If you worked up a hunger, Huntington Bank will provide free hot dogs, chips, and water in the bank parking lot and after you are full, there's kids' games, "frolic" carnival ride and Jacob's Ladder, the Waterball Tournament, Live Music by Larry Stevens at the FOE, and the Inflatable Costume Race at 3 p.m. Sure there's a 50/50 raffle drawing at the Chamber booth and the winners of the Grand Parade will be announced at 4 p.m., and the Duck Race at 5 p.m., and the greased pig contest at 6 p.m. at the north end of the Veteran's Memorial Park, but wait until the night approaches. The Music on Main Glow Party will finish Saturday with a literal bang of the Fireworks.



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But the piece de resistance is the
